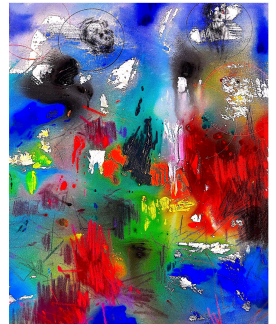




## 'The Bones Are Still Crying' I & II ( Diptych)
