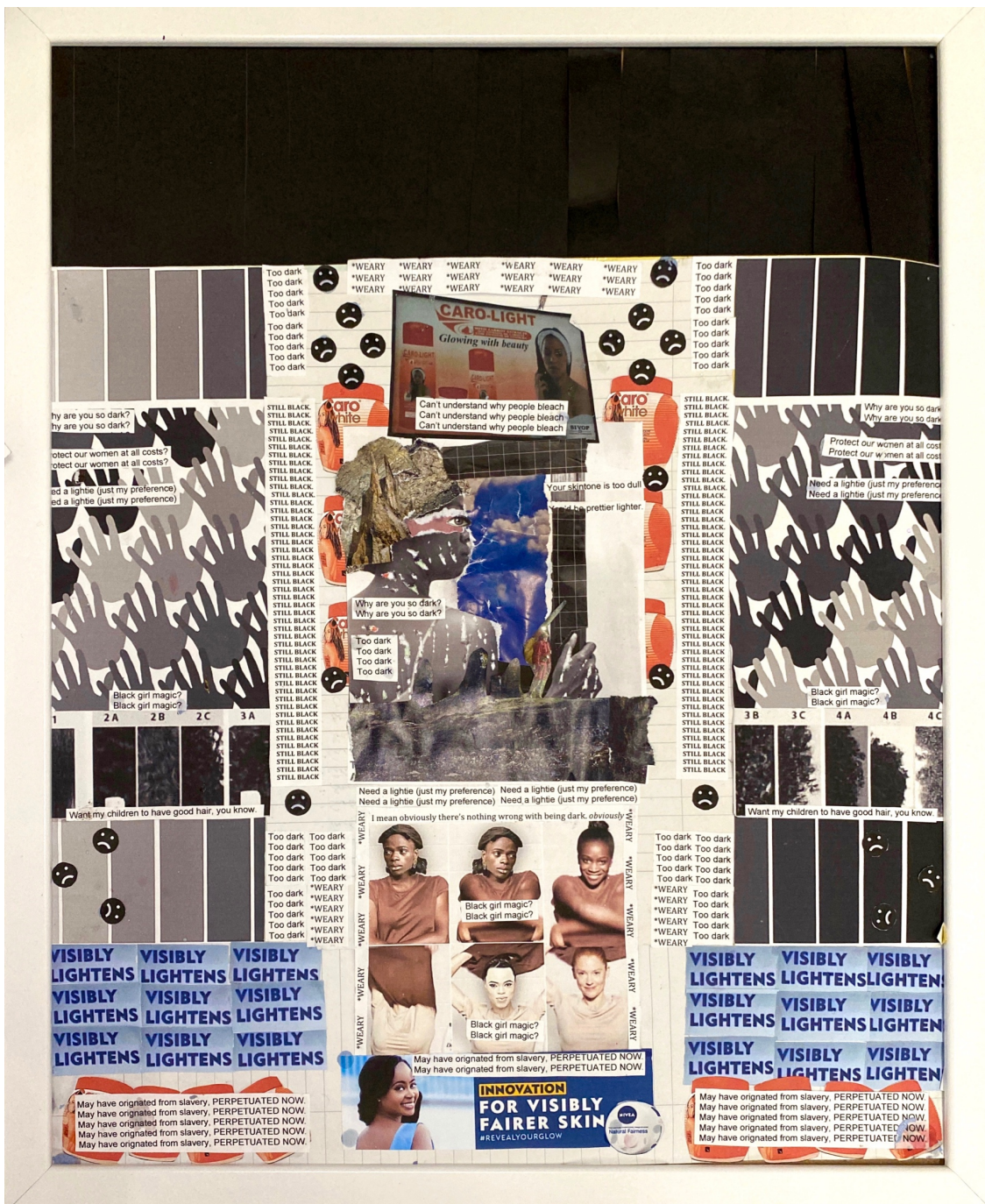




Colourism (Still Black)
