monochrome artworks. Through digital rendering, she carefully accentuates or subtly minimizes specific elements, setting the stage for the next steps. With Fabriano paper as her canvas, she meticulously sketches and paints, employing a range of techniques:

- Graphite precisely captures intricate details
- India Ink, applied to wet paper, introduces delightful unpredictability, yielding unique hues and shadows
- Black and white charcoal harmoniously unites the elements, binding techniques together.

This synergy of digital and traditional media culminates in breathtaking high-contrast monochrome artworks that showcase the beauty of nature.
